

OPEN SWINE SHOW

Release for swine not in Market show: Saturday September 14, 2019, after 10:00PM

1. All animals must be checked in prior to 5:30PM Friday, September 13, 2019.
2. Entry fee of \$20 per animal due with application. Entries post marked after August 30, 2019, will be charged a \$10 late fee. There will be no day-of-show entries.
3. To be accepted, entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor and a parent or guardian if exhibitor is under 18 years of age, and must be received with all required fees.
4. Each pig entry is allowed to be used only once in showmanship. Using the same pig for multiple showmanship exhibitors is prohibited. Any exhibitors found to be using the same pig will be disqualified and will forfeit all entry fees and prize money.
5. If participating in showmanship, additional entry fee of \$5 per exhibitor due with application. Age division for open swine show only are as follows: Novice (Under 8), Junior (ages 9-12), Intermediate (ages 13-16) and Senior (ages 17-21).
6. Showmanship money will be split as follows...1st-50%, 2nd-30%, 3rd-20% of all entry money received for that age group.
7. Prize money will be split as follows...Grand Champion-40%, Reserve Grand-20% of all entry money received. The remaining 40% will be used to help cover expense of judge.
8. Swine will be judged on current market characteristics. The judge's decisions are final in all classes.
9. Barrows and gilts only, **NO Boars** will be allowed.
10. Exhibitors must be five years old or older on the day of show.
11. There will not be a market sale for the Open Swine Show.
12. **Health certificates are required for all entries.** All out of state swine must also have a Florida permit number on the health papers. Permit number can be obtained by your veterinarian by contacting Doyle Conner at (850) 410-0956. All health papers must be issued within 90 days if raised within the State of Florida. If raised outside of the state Florida, the health papers must be issued within 30 days of September 14, 2019.
13. Any swine going back to farm after show will require proper test certifications: (OCVI) Health certificate required, Brucellosis, Pseudorabies, Isolation (30 days).
14. Swine going to slaughter will be owner's responsibility.
15. All swine must be from accepted market breeds. No feral animals or swine crossed with wild hogs will be accepted.
16. There is no limit on the number of swine that can be entered by a single exhibitor; however, total entries will be limited to first 68 entries.
17. Swine will be divided into weight classes for show. Weight classes will be determined at weigh-in.
18. All exhibitors showing in the open show must assign a sole caretaker.
19. All crossbreds must have a readable ear tag. Purebreds can use the ear notch system.
20. All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning pens prior to leaving barns.
21. Shavings will be provided.
22. The Baker County Fair Livestock Committee reserves the right to close the registration period prior to the deadline if necessary.
23. The Baker County Fair Livestock Committee reserves the right to make changes deemed to be in the best interest of the show.
24. The Baker County Fair Association nor the Baker County Fair Livestock Committee will be responsible for any accidents or injuries that occur. The Baker County Fair Association nor the Baker County Fair Livestock Committee will be responsible for any lost or stolen personal items or damages to personal property.
