1. Exhibitors must view both videos and submit the video quiz. **If the Exhibitor, along with a parent or guardian, does not turn in the video quiz, the Exhibitor will be deemed NOT to have watched the video and therefore not be allowed to show or sale the animal at the 2022 fair.**
2. All swine must be tagged on Saturday, June 11, 2022, between the hours of 7:00AM–9:00AM, at the Baker County fairgrounds. There are no weight restrictions on pigs at the initial tagging.
3. Exhibitors may tag two (2) swine at the initial tagging only. However, only one (1) swine may be shown in the show. Exhibitors who are members of one family may tag an alternate swine (ie: three brothers and sisters may tag an alternate swine for that family).
4. If any swine dies or is injured, crippled, etc., the exhibitor may show their alternate swine, if it was tagged in at the beginning tag-in. Swine cannot be replaced after the beginning tagging and identification on Saturday, June 11, 2022.
5. Exhibitor, club, group, etc., must have owned/cared for their swine since the initial tagging date.
6. Swine will be received for the fair on Sunday, September 18, 2022, from 2:00PM – 4:30PM. The final weigh-in will be on Sunday, September 11 2022, from 2:00PM – 4:30PM.  
**NOTE:** Exhibitors, who also entered their market swine into the open show, will **NOT** have the option to re-weigh their swine on Sunday, September 18, 2022.
7. Swine must weigh a minimum of 225 lbs at the final weigh-in on Sunday, September 18, 2022, with a **maximum of 295 lbs. and a maximum payout of 295 lbs. Animals will be weighed only once.** The only exception will be at the request of the livestock chairman between these hours only.
8. All swine meeting the entry requirements will be allowed into the show after final weigh-in utilizing overflow pens. **If the number of entries exceeds 68, then overflow pens will be used starting with the lowest weight and working up until all eligible swine has been penned.**
  - A. Hogs that are visibly sick, cripple or show evidence of stress may be cut.
10. All exhibitors must turn in an up-to-date record book at the fairgrounds no later than the Record Book Deadline listed above. Record books will be available on the Fair’s web site ([www.BakerCountyFair.com](http://www.BakerCountyFair.com)) on or before the initial weigh-in.
11. All Swine will be checked by the State Health Inspectors before they are unloaded. No health certificates will be required for swine entering the market show only. There will be no swine removed off of any trucks or trailers, until they are approved by the state inspectors. All swine entered in the show and sale will not be allowed to return to the owners’ home or farm. They must go to the processing shop directly from the fair grounds at the conclusion of the fair – no exceptions.
12. All exhibitors will comply with the “Agricultural Division General Rules” and the “Animal Health Rules” as shown on the Baker County Fair website.
13. All exhibitors must be an official member of the Baker County FFA or Baker County 4H.
14. **Any exhibitor that is disrespectful to any adult while at the fair, at any time during the 9 days of the fair, will be disqualified from showing and selling their market animal(s) in future Baker County Fairs. The determination of disrespect will be made at the discretion of the Baker County Fair Association.**

15. All swine must be from accepted breeds, no feral or swine-crossed with wild swine will be accepted.
16. Every exhibitor must sign a statement that any drug, antibiotic, wormer or biological substance which may have been administered by them or any other person was done so in strict compliance with the manufacturer's label requirements.
17. Swine showmanship will be a separate show. Swine showmanship will be held on the date and time shown on page 1 of the swine rules. Exhibitors will be judged on their ability to display their animals and themselves. The showmanship judge will be present during the judging of the respective classes. Exhibitors are encouraged to dress in the colors of their respective organization.
18. All swine will be sold to the highest bidder at the sale. All sales will be final.
19. The order of sale will be: First, the Grand Champion Swine and Second, the Reserve Champion Swine. The Individual First Place Class Winners then will be next. The remaining swine will be sold according to the number drawn by the individual swine owner at the Exhibitors/Parents Meeting on Sunday, September 18, 2022, 5:30 p.m.
20. The maximum sale weight is 295 lbs. **Swine weighing over 295 lbs will be sold at 295 lbs.**
21. All purchases and across the board add-ons must be paid to the Baker County Fair Association, P. O. Box 492, Macclenny, Fl. 32063. All add-ons must be turned in no later than the end of the sale on Thursday, September 22, 2022. The Fair Association will not accept add-ons after that time.
22. 3% of the total sale price plus add-ons of the swine will be charged per animal by the Baker County Fair Association. This will help with expenses of judges, plaques, ribbons, sale books, and buyer thank-you ads in newspapers, as well as future improvements to livestock area.
23. Each exhibitor is required to write thank you letters to those who purchased their animal AND to those who contributed add-ons. These letters must be in stamped envelopes and turned in to the FFA Advisor or 4H leader no later than December 20, 2022. If acceptable\* thank-you letters are not received by the FFA advisor or 4H leader by the below dates, the below stated amount of the exhibitor's check will be forfeited to the Baker County Fair. No checks will be disbursed until **all** monies are received by the fair association.  
Thank you letters not turned in by....  
November 30, 2022, exhibitor will forfeit \$50 of check amount  
December 21, 2022, exhibitor will forfeit \$100 of check amount  
January 6, 2023, exhibitor will forfeit \$200 of check amount  
Forfeited funds will be used for a scholarship fund for graduating seniors.  
\*FFA Advisors and 4H leaders will determine what is deemed "acceptable".

### **Ribbon Premiums: Blue \$40.00 Red \$30.00 White \$20.00**

- **If any Board member or Livestock member observes any animal not being fed or watered, that student will be given a warning, 2<sup>nd</sup> offense could result in future eligibility to show.**
